He is one of only two diplomates in equine critical care working in Europe and the only one in Ireland. Kevin is particularly well known for his work in intensive care of foals. Kevin completed a PhD in immunology then trained as a specialist medicine clinician at Marion duPont Scott Equine Medical Center, Virginia, USA. He then taught at the Royal Veterinary College in London for five years. Kevin is recognized as a specialist both in internal medicine and critical care. Kevin has published extensively in his field. He has contributed to seven textbooks, including "The Equine Hospital Manual" which he jointly edited with Jennifer Stephen. Kevin has been an invited speaker to many national and international conferences. He has lectured for veterinarians, veterinary nurses, veterinary and nursing students, students on stud management courses and the public. Kevin currently works at Anglesey Lodge Equine Hospital (www.aleh.ie) on the Curragh in County Kildare. His clinical interests include cardiology and neurology as well as intensive care and foal medicine.

Liz qualified in June 1996 from University College Dublin, and after some time doing clinical work returned to UCD and completed a Doctoral thesis "Hormonal effects on pituitary and ovarian function in cattle".
